Early Years	<p><b><u>Expressive Arts and Design</u></b> <b>Pupils will be taught to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Safely use and explore materials, tools and techniques.</li> <li>• Experiment with colour, design, texture, form and function.</li> <li>• Represent their own ideas, thoughts and feelings through design and technology, art, music, dance, role play and stories.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Physical Development</u></b> <b>Pupils will be taught to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Handle equipment and tools effectively, including pencils for writing.</li> <li>• Develop their control and coordination in large and small movements.</li> </ul>
Year 1	<p><b><u>Art and Design</u></b> <b>Pupils will be taught:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products</li> </ul> <p>The children will use clay, sketching pencils, collage, water colour, poster and brusho paint, natural objects, papier mache and oil pastels to design and make products.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination</li> </ul> <p>The children will make a firework painting, learn to sketch their friend and animals of their choice and make a clay and a papier mache sculpture.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space</li> </ul> <p>The children will explore these terms throughout each art lesson: colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.</li> </ul> <p>The children will learn about the life and works of Jackson Pollock and Andy Goldworthy. They will make their own works of art with these artists' techniques in mind. The children will explore various painters' interpretations of animals and they will compare, contrast and create their own painting with these various practices in mind.</p>
Year 2	<p><b><u>Art and Design</u></b> <b>Pupils will be taught:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products</li> </ul> <p>The children will continue to learn and use clay, sketching pencils, collage, water colour, poster and brusho paint, papier mache and oil pastels to design and make products. In addition, this year they will use powder paint, neon paint for light effects, charcoal and lino printing inks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination</li> </ul> <p>The children will make mixed media pictures of the Great fire of London, they will sketch tropical fruit and they will use clay to make a clay planet and one of the seven wonders of the world.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space</li> </ul> <p>The children will use these terms throughout each art lesson to enhance every aspect of their final product: colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space. This could be considered with emotional intentions or literal ones. The children will build upon their existing knowledge by exploring the colours that occur in nature such as Bioluminescence and adding tints and tones to colours. They will learn how to integrate collage as a technique for adding texture and drama. The children will learn how to use graded pencils to depict shape, texture and colour tone.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.</li> </ul> <p>The children will learn about the life and works of Quentin Blake. They will experiment and then make their own works of art using Blake's technique. The children will explore different ways craft makers design and produce lino printing prints, from past and present. They will use what they have learnt to develop and then print, a printing tile. The children will explore how different designers create chocolate wrappers and they will compare different styles. They will compare and contrast existing art works from around the world. They will create their own work of art and then reflect upon how it is the same and how it is different from their favoured artist techniques.</p>
