



Phonics-

Hello all! Phonics is a little different this week! The Department for Education has commissioned and recorded a series of daily phonics lessons aimed at children in Reception and Year 1. These daily lessons follow the similar structure we would teach within the classroom; Revisit, Recap, Practise and Apply. Each recording is around 30 minutes long and gives children the opportunity to verbalise, read and apply their understanding in a written context whilst using their segmenting and blending skills. 
