

## Early Years Home Learning WB 2.11.20

We hope you all enjoyed the half term break.

This week we will be starting a new topic called 'Colour Explosion.' We will be learning about Fireworks night this week and doing some literacy, maths and creative activities to do with this celebration.

Remember to take care if you celebrate Fireworks Night, you could look online for tips about how to stay safe.

### Literacy

In literacy we will be designing a fireworks picture and writing words to describe the fireworks. First you will need to create a picture that looks like the sky on fireworks night. You could use chalk, glitter and black paper or use a crayon on white paper and wash over with watery black paint. After you have created your picture you could write words on labels or onto your picture that describe the fireworks, e.g. pop, bang, sparkle.



### Maths

We will be learning to count down from 10 this week in maths, like a rocket blast off! We will be making a rocket and sticking numbers on the flame that count back from 10 to 0. You could make your own rocket and write numbers on the flame. Make sure you start at 10 and practice counting backwards.




## Phonics

This week we will continue learning phonics. We will look at the letters '**M**' and '**D**' and learn their names, sounds, action and how to write them.

You could look at Geraldine Giraffe videos for the sounds '**M**' and '**D**' on YouTube.

Look for objects around your house that start with these sounds, e.g. mouse, dice, mat, dog. See if you can write the letter and say the sound.



## Reading

We will continue reading in school with our teachers; keep practicing your reading at home.

Enjoy spending time at home with a grown up sharing a story. Look out for any of the sounds that we have learnt in phonics that are in the words in your book. After you have finished reading you could discuss the story. Remember to record in your reading record.
