### Enhancing ICT

Our children have loved accessing our modern interactive whiteboards, installed in each class base. Each board is bright, touch screen and encourages the very latest technologies for our pupils to use. These are part of our strategic vision for enhancing our use of technology and compliment the iPads, Laptops and other equipment used extensively by all our children. Our website is continually being updated and provides detailed information to support you and your children.

### Our commitment to good health

The school menu continues to be popular with our children. In particular the roast dinners, pizzas and fish fingers which are always favourite choices. The lunchtime supervisor team led by Mrs Eastley work very well with our children during the dinnertime period. Our children enjoy brushing their teeth at the start of each afternoon session. This continues our responsibility to ensure that our children's health and well being is encouraged. Fruit and milk are provided each day as well as fresh water. Our school Nurse is available to meet with parents and referrals can be made via Mrs Fancy/Mrs Southall.



### Charities and the Community

We are always overwhelmed by your amazing support for our charity days. Last year we raised a staggering £1316.00 for the Daral Akram Orphan School in Brikama and £2316 for Sports Relief to name just two. Looking forward, we will be continuing to support the Portsmouth Foodbank, Macmillan, Jeans for Genes, Children in Need, Comic Relief and Mrs Phelan will be returning to Africa to revisit the orphan school in The Gambia.



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## Celebrating Curriculum Success

We have been delighted to celebrate outstanding success over the past year with some of our strengths highlighted below.

- In Early Years, our pupils made wonderful progress with results in line with those achieved nationally. We have been praised city wide for our excellent teaching and learning within the Early Years and have hosted many visiting teachers to observe the EYFS Curriculum. Our boys at Stamshaw perform higher than boys in the rest of the country and the success of our Magic Markers writing intervention has resulted in significant gains in writing across all pupils.
- Once again we have achieved excellent results with our Phonics Screening with 81% of our pupils meeting the standard (compared with Portsmouth outcomes of 79%). This again represents superb progress and is a testament to the commitment from our teachers, pupils and parents.
- KS1 outcomes this year were superb. Combined results in Reading, Writing and Maths showed that pupils reaching the 'expected' and the 'higher standard', were **higher than** schools in Portsmouth **and** Nationally placing us in the **top 7** schools in the city. Once again the outcomes for boys exceeded those nationally which we are absolutely delighted about.

**The school was moderated by external assessors and achieved 100% accuracy in the judgements made by teachers. We were commended on the excellent evidence that we submitted and on the superb progress made by all our children.**

Our curriculum continues to be rich and exciting with many school trips, visitors and 'Wow' days enhancing the children's passion and creativity. Here is an overview of the exciting topics for 2018/2019

## Wraparound Before and After School Club

Our wraparound care continues to be a very popular before and after school provision for our working parents.
