

Sport Premium Funding 2018 – 19

The Sport Premium Funding was introduced to schools in May 2013, with money being made available to schools from October 2013. In light of the success of the Olympic Games the government is spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in Primary schools. This extra funding has been allocated directly to Primary Headteachers, with schools being given freedom to spend the funding in ways that will enhance pupils' participation and attainment within PE and Sport. Funding for 2017–18 doubled with a Government commitment to continue funding until at least 2019/20.

Here at Stamshaw Infant School, we have been allocated £7392 for April to August 2018 with an additional £10,319 for September 2018 to March 2019. Funding has been spent creatively to enhance our PE provision and provide new, exciting ways to broaden our children's sporting experiences.

Our Vision

Our vision of 'Helping stars to shine brightly' is at the heart of the school's belief, so we wanted to provide the children at our school with the opportunity to reach their full potential by enhancing the PE provision in place and introducing them to new and exciting competitive sports. We aim to use our School Sport Premium to ensure that we provide measurable and sustained improvement in school PE and sport ensuring pupils are physically literate with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

With the funding we aim to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport by:

- Encouraging healthy lifestyles we will offer the children new experiences, with the focus on carrying on these sports as they get older.
- Engaging ALL pupils in regular physical activities which will encourage healthy active lifestyles.
- Promoting competitiveness offer competition and participation to all children, through festivals and tournaments.
- Teaching new life skills and broaden the experience of a range of sports and activities offered to children
- Increasing and enhancing the confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff teaching PE and sports our children will experience high quality coaching from experts who will work alongside our teachers.
- Raising the profile of PE and sports across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
